


# PREVENTION MONTH inwheel Part

#### TRAININGS AVAILABLE



Stewards of Children® is the only nationally available program scientifically proven to increase knowledge, improve attitudes, and change child-protective behaviors. This training will teach adults how to prevent, recognize, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse.





Child/Teen Safety Matters®, created by the Monique Burr Foundation, is a comprehensive evidence-based child abuse prevention curriculum. Child Safety Matters is for students in grades K-5, and Teen Safety Matters is for students in grades 6-12.

#### CACWC News You Can Use

In April 2023, Ohio became the 38th state to enact Erin's Law. This law, named after childhood sexual assault survivor, author, speaker and activist Erin Merryn, requires that all schools in the state provide annual developmentally appropriate instruction on child sexual abuse prevention education for children in grades K-6, and sexual violence prevention education for children in grades 7-12.

During the fall of 2023, the CACWC was proud to begin partnering with school districts in Warren County to help bring this education to local classrooms. Using the Child / Teen Safety Matters curriculum, the CACWC presented child abuse prevention education to over 3,000 K-12 students in Warren County during the fall of 2023, and that number is expected to double by the end of the 2023-2024 school year.



As a direct result of these presentations, multiple children have come forward to disclose their own experiences, some for the first time. The CACWC has been honored to help empower the children of Warren County to bring their darkness to light.
